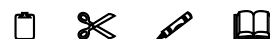
Two new Home Visitors and an Administrative Assistant to Executive Director Betsy Marlow joined the staff of Miss Ruby's Kids in January. A generous grant from the Sisters of Charity Foundation made it possible for the program to hire a full time administrative staff person and an additional Home Visitor who will be working with Latino children and their families. The second Home Visitor was hired to because of the increase in the number of families served from 17 in 2006 to 25 in 2007.

Jamie Bromell, our new Administrative Assistant, is the smiling face you will encounter on a visit to our Front Street office. Jamie's duties include getting office files and materials in order, updating computer forms, preparing and creating materials needed by the Executive Director for workshops or home visits, handling the many phone calls that come in daily, and overall office management. 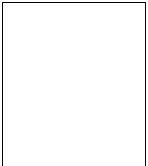
